

Highlights from the Board Meeting Held on September 20th, 2023

Chairman Tammy Mayo called the meeting to order with 13 members in attendance.

Rhonda Gorman presented the Treasurer's Report. The Church began with a balance of \$206,271.10 on July 1st. Total receipts were \$15,309.72, total disbursements were \$16,220.60. This gives a balance in Regular Checking of \$205,360.22. We have a \$2,492.73 balance in our Givelify account which gives us a total balance of \$207,852.95 as of August 31st, 2023. As for our Designated Funds, we have \$125 in the Food Pantry, \$100 for Bible Study, \$100 for the Cemetery, \$150 for the Building Fund, \$1,020 for Missions - Maui, \$400 in the Samaritan Fund and \$120 for Worship which is a total of \$2,015. Our Parsonage Account has \$13,313.29. We have two CDs that total \$100,812.45. Report was accepted.

Mary Anne Barlow presented the Cemetery Treasurer's Report dated July 1st through September 20th, 2023. The current Principal Amount for a CD (not to be used for upkeep) is \$26,935 with \$700 being held to place in a CD. The current amount in General Checking (to be used for general maintenance for the cemetery) is \$14,022.43. The account still owes for grass cutting for 2022 and 2023. Report was accepted.

Billy Lloyd started the discussion on the thermostat setting. It was suggested the setting needs to be at 75 degrees and set back to 72 for Sunday service. Tammy advised she would discuss it with Jeff Clough.

Committee reports were given.

Pastor Bob Lane mentioned we had visitors sign our register and didn't know if we had procedures in place to acknowledge their visit. Jane Harris stated Suzanne Bowman usually sends visitors a card and suggested he check with her. Jane Harris and Mary Anne Barlow recently made some cards for Suzanne.

Bob asked if the Sunday school class for young people was still meeting. Pastor Andy Rose said this class historically included the youth group kids and someone needs to take over and Bob said he would do so and let the parents know it's still available.

As for Church renovations, the storage room still needs to be built. Billy Lloyd advised that the contractor went to the Planning Department on August 14th but he has not received an update.

Pam Hart gave a report on the 150th Anniversary Jubilee planning. UPDATE: There was a nice crowd and a wonderful and joyous celebration on October 8th.

Dianne Montgomery is checking to see if Kenny Davis is finished with the parking lot gravel.

Audits need to be completed on the General Fund and filed in the Treasurer's book. Jane Harris, Tammy Mayo, and Patricia Hicks will audit up to the last bank statement for the General Fund. Billy Lloyd agreed to audit the Cemetery Fund.

The second purchase of playground mulch was 11 bags, less than what was previously approved. Tammy confirmed that Billy should order what he thinks we need to finish covering the playground, probably a full skid (40-60 bags).

Tammy plans to review the By-laws/Constitution, possibly at the next meeting.

Billy said the front door still needs a closer. The Board authorized him to purchase one at approximately \$110. We are also waiting for them to fix the sweep under the door. Ronnie Bagby will install aluminum siding where storm doors were connected to building and wrap outside of the windows. There is still some electrical work to be done (light switch and flood light on playground, repair to light switch in back of Sunday school hall and speaker in vestibule and fellowship hall).

Jane Harris stated our current insurance agency will no longer insure churches so now she will be looking for an insurance company.

The basketball hoop keeps falling over. It was discussed and due to its age, Steve Montgomery will remove it.

Rhonda Gorman advised shoeboxes will be in the vestibule beginning October 15th and Abby Brown will meet with CYF November 12th to assemble the boxes for delivery.

Tammy Mayo adjourned the meeting.


